#### **In Soviet Union (among others): First row: Shubnikov (shot in 38) Leipunski (jailed), Landau(jailed), Kapitza(could not returned to UK)**



#### Kharkov 1934

#### At the end of the thirties double movement has occurred:

- > From one field of physics to another from nuclear to LT( Kapitza) from solid state to nuclear (Kurchatov)
- > Deep modification of the geographical repartition of scientists in Europe and from Europe to the US.

#### **Consequences in LTD :**



> First low temperature detection by Kurti in Oxford: 1,5g radium near adiabatic demagnetization cryostat !

> > Superfluidity of Helium ...in Moscow by Kapitza, because of Stalin ... in Cambridge by Allen & Misener, in spite of Stalin

# Cosmic Microwave Background and Infrared Astronomy

During the late 1950's, H. E. D. Scovil and his associates at Bell Labs were building the world's lowest-noise microwave amplifiers,ruby travelling-wave masers. These amplifiers were cooled to 4.2 K or less by liquid helium

#### **Infrared spectroscopy was already existing F.D.Low**

Temperature =  $2 {}^{\circ}K$ Area = 1 x 1 mm Focal Ratio = f/15Wavelength = 7 - 14 microns

Background Power, Q = 2 x  $10^{-7}$  watts G = 1 x  $10^{-6}$  watt/<sup>O</sup>K NEP = 3 x  $10^{-14}$  watt/Hz<sup>1/2</sup> Chopping Frequency = 20 Hz

The questions arise : "What of the future ?" ; As detector sensitivity increases through future developments, can we expect an ever increasing observational sensitivity? It is clear that the answer is negative unless the background power can be reduced {...}

By refrigerating the entire telescope and placing it in space, it should be possible to extand The observational capability by several orders of magnitude.
